The Long Prairie City Council met in regular session at City Hall, 7:00 p.m., Monday, May 7, 2018. Mayor Don Rasmussen called the meeting to order with the following present: Council members Tony Towle, Devin Hines, Lilah Gripne and City Administrator/Clerk Brenda Thomes. Councilor Randy Mechels was absent.

Councilor Gripne motioned Hines seconded to approve the agenda as is. Motion carried.

Councilor Hines motioned Towle seconded to approve the council minutes of April 16, 2018. There was a revision to the minutes which was already changed. Motion carried.

Kent Louwagie explained to the council the motion brought forward by the Airport Commission relating to the 500 foot extension at Todd Field.

Councilor Gripne motioned Towle seconded to authorize the engineers to go forward with the advertisement of bids for the 500 foot runway extension project at Todd Field. Motion carried.

Councilor Towle motioned Gripne seconded to approve the \$8,000 that has already been done on County Road 38 and County Road 5; and the improvements for possibly 2020 to work with Todd County Engineer up to \$5,000 more on completing the agreement for City of Long Prairie and Todd County to work together on some road projects in either 2020 or 2022. Motion carried.

Councilor Gripne motioned Towle seconded to post a position for a new public works employee and for that employee to have a D, C, or B wastewater and water license or a combination. Motion carried.

Public works has requested to purchase a zero turn mower. The two bids show a Simplicity and a John Deere Tractor mower. One for \$8,500 and the other one for \$5,268. The request is to not do a trade in and to purchase a mower outright.

There was a request to purchase internet service at the Christie House Carriage House and Administrator Thomes needs to get some additional information before council will consider this action.

Councilor Gripne motioned Towle seconded to approve the Agua Gorda Cooperative Lease Agreement for 2018. Motion carried.

Administrator Thomes will bring back bids again for mosquito spraying for 2018 at Lake Charlotte Park and Frisbee Park.

Mayor Rasmussen motioned Gripne seconded to get bids for the water tower so the project could be in 2019. Administrator Thomes will work on getting bids. Motion carried.

Mayor Rasmussen talked about looking at a couple streets that do not have water and sewer and looking at just doing a mill and overlay on a few streets. Mayor Rasmussen will work with Administrator Thomes and Public Works Director to get a couple bids together.

Administrator Thomes noted that Elite is in town starting to dig fiber again this summer.
