City of Long Prairie Council meeting 7:00 P.M., Monday, May 21, 2018

The Long Prairie City Council met in regular session at City Hall, 7:00 p.m., Monday, May 21, 2018. Mayor Don Rasmussen called the meeting to order with the following present: Council members Tony Towle, Devin Hines, Lilah Gripne, Randy Mechels and Deputy Clerk Deb Blake.

Councilor Gripne motioned Towle seconded to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Councilor Gripne motioned Hines seconded to approve the council minutes of May 7th and the May bills. Motion carried.

Kent Louwagie of Bolton & Menk gave the following update:

- City hall landscaping will be wrapped up in the next 2 weeks
- 2016 project area by the ballfields are being worked on
- Seeding touchup seeding could be complete by June 4th
- Airport June 13th bid opening on the extension with construction possibly to begin in the fall
- EDA ad for bids July 12th for Wastewater Treatment Plant
- Central Bi ammonia levels are high, may have to limit flows
- LP Packing diverting from Pond #1 and blending with pond #6
- Pollution Control Agency grant approval for final plans & specs for the Wastewater Treatment Facility
- Water Supply Plan Bolton & Menk, Inc. proposes to provide engineering services for completion of the DNR Water Supply Plan for a not-to-exceed fee of \$15,000. Final completion of plan for submittal prior to October 15, 2018.

Councilor Gripne motioned Mechels seconded to table the Water Supply Plan until Administrator Thomes returns. Motion carried.

City Council has approved the Housing rehab Grant for \$15,000 for Cody and Sarah Nelson to construct 2 4-Plex Townhomes located at 111 1st Avenue South and 113 1st Avenue South. Cody has come back to the city to ask for an additional \$15,000 for a total of \$30,000 in Housing Rehab Grant Funds. This would use most all of the funds. Cody has also asked to extend the TIF District to 13 years instead of 10 years.

Councilor Gripne motioned Towle seconded to extend the TIF District from 10 to 13 years for Cody and Sarah Nelson. Motion carried.

Councilor Towle motioned Gripne seconded to approve \$30,000 in Housing Rehab Grant funds for Cody and Sarah Nelson. Motion carried.

Council discussed the sale of the empty lot next to the VFW property from Todd County to Cody Nelson. The Resolution authorizing the sale was not done in accordance with Minnesota Statute §373.01. However, Minnesota Statute §465.035 allows a County to transfer real estate to another governmental entity such as the City without having to go through the process in Statute §373.01. In turn, the City can then authorize the sale of the land for a public use such as housing development, to Mr. Nelson by simply passing a resolution and without any public bid requirements. As a result, Mr. Nelson could have full title to the property by next week.

Councilor Gripne motioned Towle seconded to approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the City of Long Prairie has been approached by Cody Nelson who is attempting to develop the former VFW property and an adjacent lot owned by Todd County into two 4-plex housing units; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Prairie is in need of this type of housing; and

WHEREAS, this type of housing project will serve a public use; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized to purchase the property from Todd County pursuant to Minnesota Statute §465.035; and

WHEREAS, the County has offered to sell the property to the City of Long Prairie for Sixteen Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$16,000.00); and

WHEREAS, the City has received a Purchase Agreement from Cody Nelson to purchase the property from the City of Long Prairie for Sixteen Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$16,000.000; and

WHEREAS, structuring this transaction will expedite the transfer of the property from Todd County to Cody Nelson; and

WHEREAS, without the expedition of the project, the project may not happen; and

WHEREAS, the property describe herein is adjacent to the Former VFW building; and

WHEREAS, the former VFW building has sat vacant since last year and will continue to deteriorate and cause harm to the neighborhood if the building is not demolished; and

WHEREAS, as part of the development of the 4-plexes, Cody Nelson will demolish the VFW building.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that:

1. The City is authorized to purchase the property legally described as follows, to-wit:

The West 25 feet of Lot 2, Block 1, Tweed's Fourth Addition to the Village of Long Prairie, and Lot 3, Block 1, Tweed's Fourth Addition to the Village of Long Prairie, EXCEPT the West One (1) foot. According to the plat thereof on file and of record at the County Recorder's Office, in and for said Todd County, MN;

From Todd County pursuant to Minnesota Statute §465.035.

- 2. The City Council authorized Don Rasmussen and Brenda Thomes to execute any and all documents to effectuate the purchase of the property described herein from Todd County.
- 3. That the purchase of the property described herein will serve a public use in providing additional quality housing for the residents of Long Prairie that is greatly needed.
- 4. If this project does not move forward it is likely that the VFW property will remain vacant, unused and will continue to deteriorate, which will result in harm to the neighborhood.
- 5. The proposed Purchase Agreement between the City of Long Prairie and Cody Nelson is hereby approved.
